## ACCREDITATION UPDATE

At the beginning of November, three CARF surveyors from the United States spent 3 days evaluating KDSCL services to determine if we were in compliance with the standards set out by CARF. CARF is a private, not-for-profit organization that accredits programs and services in Adult Day Services, Assisted Living, Behavioral Health, Employment and Community Services and Medical Rehabilitation. CARF develops and maintains practical and relevant standards of quality for such programs.

The standards are developed by the field, which consists of the persons receiving services, rehabilitation professionals, and purchasers of services, and are applied through a peer review process to determine how well an organization is serving it's consumers. Every year the standards are reviewed and new ones are developed to keep pace with changing conditions and current consumer needs.

The surveyors based on an evaluation of the organization's compliance with the standards determines if they are in complete compliance and issue a 3-year designation, in partial compliance and issue a 1 year designation or not in compliance with no designation. KDSCL will know the outcome of our survey in 6 to 8 weeks. We are optimistic and anxiously await the results.
